1. varies, appropriate answers include: Internet, magazine, expert, card catalog sources
2. Varies according to student data. Examples for a Doberman might include:
 - Subtopic: Behavior
 - Details: Can be aggressive when trained for police work, as a guard dog, or other similar task.
3. The Internet has many advantages as a research tool. First, it provides easy access to a wide variety of information. Also, it contains both current and older sources but usually the former makes it an advantage. For example, a library might have an old encyclopedia collection on the shelf while the Internet allows access to the current year's version. Also, use of the Internet for research is mostly free. People do not have to buy sources or pay for shipping of sources.
4. PowerPoint can be used as a visual aid to help the audience follow the points of the speaker's presentation or it can enhance the presentation by adding graphics and key words. It can help the speaker by using it as an outline/ organizer.
5. The answer should contain at least two of the following: lists relevant facts and details, identifies location of sources, organizes ideas.
The answer should contain five of the following: pace, audience, appropriate sound level, use of visual aids, purpose, grammar, word choice, audible voice, clear language
